Women's Captain's Report

24th March 2025



I have great pleasure to report on the activity of the women's section of Clonliffe Harriers AC during the 12 months up to 23rd March 2025.

As a result of the dedicated commitment to training of our athletes, the guidance of our coaches and time offered by all volunteers, Clonliffe women have enjoyed many individual and team highlights:

- In early '25, Lorraine O'Connor ran a 12-second PB clocking a time of 4.22.73 over 1500m, setting a new Clonliffe club senior indoor record at the British Milers indoor meet in Cardiff.
- Grace Casey threw a club record of 43.99m to secure silver in the National Senior '24 T&F. In 2025, Grace has already bettered her record throwing 44.52m in the Dunboyne Throws Invitational.
- Jess Tappin set a new club record in the 400 hurdles at the Bryan Clay Invitational '24 in Azusa, California, with a time of 57.02. Additionally, Jess also set a new club record in the 100 hurdles at the Newham & Essex Beagles Stratford Speed GP in London, running a time of 13.86 (W +0.7m/s)
- Edel Maguire claimed 7 W65 National records during '24/25 outdoor and indoor season.
 - World Record (equalling) and National Record W65 High jump, 1.39m World Masters Gothenberg Gold (outdoor)
 - National Record W65 200m, 30.96 at World Masters Gothenberg Bronze (outdoor)
 - National Record W65 400m, 1.08.84 at British Masters Silver (outdoor)
 - National Record W65 High jump, 1.35m National Indoor league
 - National Record W65 60m, 8.99 at National Masters Indoors
 - European Record (subject to ratification) and National Record W65 200m, 29.97 National Masters Indoors
 - European Record (subject to ratification) and National Record W65 400m, 1.08.22 British Masters Indoors
- Megan Comiskey bettered her Hammer PB, and club record, setting a new mark of 50.85m and in the Discus she threw a new club record of 45.09m in winning double U/20 gold at the Swiss National Throws

We recognised the achievements of our individual club prize winners at our Christmas cake race and awards evening on Saturday 21st December 2024.

Meghan O'Keeffe was awarded Women's road/cross country athlete of the year. Meghan represented the club throughout the year in cross country and road team events, helping the senior ladies to Dublin Intermediate victory and bronze medals in the National road 5k. On a personal level, Meghan took chunks off her previous best performances including a magnificent 15-minute plus personal best of 3:09.28 in the Berlin marathon



Grace Casey was awarded the Women's track and field athlete of the year. Grace won silver at the National Senior Outdoor T&F with a throw of 43.99m, setting a new club record at the time. Grace has since bettered this record with a 44.52m throw at the Dunboyne Invitational. Grace also achieved 1st place and maximum points in the javelin at the National League final.

Edel Maguire was awarded the Master athlete of the year. Edel was recognized by Athletics Ireland in the Master Athlete of the Year category. At the World Masters Outdoors in Gothenburg, Edel won gold in the W65 High jump with a championship equalling 1.39m. Most recently Edel has broken European and National records on the indoor circuit including 29.97 seconds for 200m and 68.22 for 400m W65.

Continuing to encourage female participation, Athletics Ireland recently encouraged clubs to appoint a Women's Support Officer. Sarah Bateson kindly volunteered to take this role.



For "Women in Sport" week held in early March '25, the club held two successful and enjoyable events. In her new role, Sarah Bateson organised a night of 800s on the track. Then, on 'International Women's Day' over 30 Clonliffe Harriers decked in club colours answered Ciara Peelo's call and took to the line at Poppintree Parkrun on a beautiful Saturday morning.

Other club highlights included a very successful senior cross country squad day with Anne Keenan-Buckley as guest speaker. A large group of 24 senior athletes and coaches travelled to AP Victoria Sports Hotel, Albufeira, Portugal for 7 days of warm weather training in early April. A further group of 8 sprinters enjoyed 2 weeks training in Estepona, Spain. In mid-September the club enjoyed a night of mixed relays courtesy of Pamela Cooper and her team of Ciara O'Regan, Johnny O'Leary, Shane Rooney, Carl Fleming, Orla Deighan and Jake Kernan.

The report that follows provides more detail on the key achievements at National and regional events as well as team success across Indoor, Outdoor Track & Field, Cross country and Road Racing competitions.

Finally, a huge "Thank you" – to my vice-captain Ciara Peelo, Club captain Noel Guiden, President Mick Kearney, Secretary Stephen Bateson, Treasurer Brian McDonald and all the committee, coaches, athletes and volunteers for all your support, hard work and enthusiasm throughout the year and in my term as captain.

I am not putting myself forward for re-election for the 2025/2026 term. It has been a great privilege for me to hold the role of Women's Captain and it has given me some truly unforgettable moments and experiences. During the last few years, and additional to my role as captain, I have enjoyed an unusual combination of training and competing with athletes across all categories from junior, senior to master and across T&F, road and cross country. This has offered me a first-hand insight into the workings of our club and it's talent. The energy and enthusiasm is delightfully contagious, the future is bright, and I hope the women's section will continue to prosper and go from strength to strength.

Indoor



At the **National Indoors** in February 2025, Niamh Kelly qualified for the 800m final and in the 1500m, Emily Bolton and Lorraine O'Connor, although still junior athletes also qualified comfortably. In the 800m final, Niamh Kelly recorded an indoor PB of 2.13.22 as she finished in 7th position. In the 1500m final, Emily Bolton finished 4th in a time of 4.27.85 with Lorraine 7th in 4.30.27.

The team placed 4th in the 2025 **National Indoor league**. Round 1 of the National League scheduled for Sunday 5th January was postponed due to weather and the competition was held over 2 rounds, with points combined rather than a 3rd final day of competition. Over both rounds, our emerging talent combined with unwavering experience shone brightly. On final tally, Clonliffe scored 177 points in a tie with St Laurence O'Toole's and just 5.5 points behind bronze medal place Craughwell AC.

Key performances included:

- Emily Bolton contributing maximum points as runaway winner of the women's 1500 clocking a time of 4.31.05.
- Niamh Whyte took a fine 6th position in the 1500 race walk.
- The 4 x 200 relay team of Emily Jachna, Rebecca Walsh, Ava Usanova and Rachael Ogundimu placed 2nd in their heat a time of 1.48.19, 6th overall.
- Edel Maguire set an Irish Masters W65 record in the high jump as she cleared 1.35m.
- In the shot Vivian Okafor took 6th position with a best of 8.48. Vivien Okafor had a fantastic throw of 5.20m for 14 points in the WFD.
- Snezana Bechtina amassed an incredible 39 individual points, with 11 points in the 60mH, 15 points in the pole vault with a height of 1.95 followed by 13 points with a 9.95m leap in the Triple jump.
- With only the relay to go, bronze medals were in touching distance. A unique 4x400 relay team combining 139 years of experience gave it their all running an absolute stormer. Snezana Bechtina set the team up, handing over the baton in 1st place in their heat. Showing true grit and determination both Isla Duncan and Sophie Kernan held onto their position and no-one was getting past them! Edel Maguire ran a fantastic final leg and running for time the team gained crucial extra points on St Laurence O'Toole only for Craughwell AC to leap frog both teams into 3rd place with an overall win in the relay!



Edel Maguire won three W65 titles at the **British Masters Indoor Championships '25** in Lee Valley. She won the 200 in 30.14, the 400 in 68.22, a European record and also the high jump with 1.35m.



At the **National Masters '25**, Edel Maguire took double gold, W65 60 in 8.99 and 200 in 29.97 both national records. Snezana Bechtina won W40 60 gold in 8.07 and then took silver in the 200 with 26.38. Vivian Okafor won gold in the WFD with 5.33m and silver in the W40 shot with a best of 8.48m.

At the **National U20 and U23 Indoor Championships '25**. In the women's U20 1500 Emily Bolton, who had won the senior schools cross country title 24 hours earlier, took silver in 4.42.40. Emily Jachna in the U20 60 ran a fine PB breaking 8 seconds for first time 7.95 in her heat. In the U20 200 heats Emily ran 26.62.

At the **Leinster Indoors '25**, there was success for Vivian Okafor as she captured gold in the W40 shot (8.28) and silver WFD (5.11). Snezana Bechtina likewise was a double medal winner as she took silver in the W40 60 (8.31) and replicated that in the 200 (26.84).

At the **British Milers** club indoor meet at the Cardiff Metropolitan University on 12th January 2025, Lorraine O'Connor ran a 12 second PB clocking a time of 4.22.73 over 1500, a new Clonliffe club senior indoor record, replacing Becky Woods' 4.25.41 set back in 2014. This is also a new Clonliffe Harriers women's U/20 record (indoor or outdoor), the previous record club U/20 record of 4.28.2 was set back in 1972 by Jean Appleby. Emily Bolton also produced an outstanding run in her race as she placed 3rd in a time of 4.27.96.

In the **NIA live** series of events, Niamh Kelly ran PB performances of 2.13.42 in the 800m and 4.51.98 in the mile (3rd fastest Clonliffe time).

Outdoor Track & Field



At the **National Senior Outdoor T&F** held at Morton stadium on 29th and 30th June 2024, Grace Casey won silver with her final throw of 43.99m, a Clonliffe Harriers club record. Niamh Kelly ran in a stacked 800 heat and finished in 7th place (2.13.68).

In the **National League '24 final**, the ladies competed with courage and enthusiasm and were rewarded with a solid 6th place. In total 23 Clonliffe women contributed during the 2 rounds of the outdoor league. The team included 6 master athletes and 8 athletes under the age of 20!

Highlights included:

- 1st place for Grace Casey with a throw of 38.32m in the javelin.
- Sorcha O'Connor's 1st place in the steeplechase in the preliminary round and Aisling Kehoe who ran the steeplechase in the final, her first time ever competing in the event.
- Vivien Okafor, debutant in WFD and shot putt.
- Edel Maguire broke 2 Irish National age group records in the high jump 1.35m and 400m in 69.39s.
- A fantastic debutante 4x100 relay team of Lily Scanlon, Ifeoma Enyoazu, Rachael Ogundimu and Maddie Njock.

At the **World Masters '24** championships in Gothenburg, Edel Maguire won gold in the W65 High jump with a championship equalling 1.39m some 8cm's clear of 2nd position, Edel also added W65 silver in the 400 clocking a time of 71.40 and bronze in W65 200 with a time of 30.96. Edel stepped down age categories and joined Snezana Bechtina and 2 other Irish athletes in the W40 4x400 relay to claim a further silver medal.

In the **National Masters '24**, Emma Byrne took silver in the W40 shot (7.50) and Ciara O'Regan, 4th W45 WFD (3.85). Frances Mansfield took W80 hammer gold (17.89). Sinead McDermott took W40 javelin bronze with a 19.51 best. In the sprints Snezana Bechtina took W40 200 gold (26.60) and silver in the 100 (13.18), to complete the set Snezana also took High Jump bronze.

At the **British Masters** in Derby, Edel Maguire ran an Irish Master's W65 record for 400 of 68.84 for silver.

At the **National U/20 and U/23** championships in Tullamore on 4th August Megan Comiskey won the U/20 discus title with a best of 43.04. Megan also placed 4th in the hammer (44.42). In the **U/20 Swiss National Championships** held in Langentha, Megan Comiskey won silver in the hammer with 44.79m and likewise in the discus (38.94m).





In the **Leinster Championships '24**, Grace Casey secured Leinster gold with a throw of 38.92m. Jean Fearon won bronze in the W45 category of the 100m with a time of 13:53. Edel Maguire took double gold in the W65 200m in a time of 30:30 and W65 high jump with an effort of 1:35m.

At the **National Spring Throws '24** in Tullamore Grace Casey won the javelin with a best throw of 39.49. Gold also for Frances Mansfield in the M75 hammer 17.91.

At the **Morton IMC '24**, Niamh Kelly won her 800m race in a new PB of 2.14.82 a winning margin by over 4 seconds. In the 3000 Sarah Bateson ran a 7 second PB of 10.17.36. A week later at the **Belfast Milers Meet '24**, Niamh Kelly ran another 800 PB of 2.12.46. In the 1500 Sarah Bateson clocked a new PB of 4.40.21 in placing 8th. Julie Larkin was 15th in this race with a new PB of 4.54.65. At the UCD Athletics Meet, Niamh Kelly took the win with a new PB of 2.11.62, putting herself 12th on the Clonliffe all-time list.

Clonliffe ladies competed in Graded meets throughout the summer. In one event which doubled as the Dublin shot put final, Emma Byrne took bronze with 7.77m. Athletes competed in the AAI Games, County Louth Championships. At the Lusk AC throws event on June 16th Emma Bryne won the senior ladies shot with a new PB of 7.82m she also made a debut in the 28lb weight for distance with a throw of 4.82. Ciara O'Regan in the WFD threw 3.89.

Jess Tappin set a new club record winning the 400 hurdles at the **Bryan Clay invitational '24** in Azusa, California in a time of 57.02. Jess also ran a new club record in the 100H at the Newham & Essex Beagles Stratford Speed GP in London bettering her own 100H record as she ran 13.86 (W +0.7).

At the **Dunboyne Throws Invitational '25** in the javelin, Grace Casey threw 44.52 extending her own club record from last year by all of half a meter.

At the **Swiss National Throws '25**, Megan Comiskey won double U/20 gold in the hammer and discus. Megan bettered her Hammer PB, and club record, setting a new mark of 50.85m and in the Discus she also set a new club record 45.09.

Cross country



A history making U20s team of Hazel Kenny, Goda Buivydyte, Lorraine O'Connor and Emily Bolton were the first women's team to take part in the **Euro clubs championship** held in Albufeira in February '25. The team finished a superb 5th, with Emily Bolton, 5th and Lorraine O'Connor 8th, Hazel Kenny, 33rd and Goda Buivydyte 42nd. A development squad of Isla Duncan and SORCHA O'Connor also completed in the open race, Isla finishing 2nd Junior and SORCHA 5th Senior.

The senior ladies stormed to **National Intermediate** team gold in Westport on Sunday 9th February '25. Helena Butterly taking gold and 1st place, Niamh Kelly 2nd, Jools Hughes 5th and Julie Larkin 9th. With all 4 in the top 10, gold was secured with 17 points with Liffey Valley in 2nd place with 43 points. The rest of the team were excellent: 13th Orna McGinley, 19th Katie Halpin and 26th Chloe Heaslip. Helena, Niamh, Jools and Julie also bagged inter county gold for Dublin.

At the **National cross-country championships '24** held at Irvinestown Castle, Co Fermanagh, the junior women took silver, qualifying now for the European clubs cross country. In the U/20 race over 4500m, Lorraine O'Connor finished 8th position, Emily Bolton 21st, next in, was Hazel Kenny in 51st with Goda Buivydyte taking 67th. Lorraine and Emily both took intercounty silver in the Dublin U/20 team. The senior women's race was ran over 7500m and the team finished in 9th position: Yuliya Taravosa 66th, Jools Hughes 67th, Meghan O'Keeffe 74th and Sarah Bateson 79th. The non-scoring team members were: Alanna Burke 85th and Katie Halpin 88th.

The senior ladies won the **Dublin Intermediate Championships '25** with Helena Butterly in 1st place and Niamh Kelly in 2nd, Meghan O'Keeffe placed 5th and Julie Larkin in 12th. A mere 1 point winning margin over Crusaders. The W50 team of Aimee Ahern 9th, Orla Deighan 20th and Anne Lyons 27th took bronze in the Dublin Masters. In the W35, Jenny Johnston placed in 15th position, next in was Cindy Hickey 18th, Ciara Peelo 32nd and Sinead McDermott 38th, with the team placing in 6th position.

Emily Bolton was crowned **All Ireland Senior Schools Cross Country champion '25** after a dominant display at Galway racecourse. Lorraine O'Connor finished in an excellent 5th position.

In the **Dublin Senior XC '24**, 5 athletes competed and led home in 13th by Jools Hughes, 16th Sarah Bateson, 18th after an outstanding run, Alanna Burke, 24th Katie Halpin and 26th Chloe Heaslip. The team finished out of the medals in 4th position. It was a great day for the U/20 women's team, taking team gold with Emily Bolton 1st and Lorraine O'Connor 2nd. Hazel Kenny was 5th and with Maya O'Reilly taking 14th for a team score of 22 the girls were well clear of second-place Lucan Harriers.

In the **Club cross country championships '24**, both the senior and master ladies completed 4 x 1500 laps. Niamh Kelly won the senior women's race, Sarah Bateson was 2nd, and Alana Burke was 3rd. Laura Kernan was 1st master woman. In the U/20 women's race, Emily Bolton was 1st, Lorraine O'Connor 2nd, guest Holly O'Brien 3rd, and newcomer Goda Buivydiene 4th but 3rd in the club championship.

The **Dublin novice cross country '24**, the first of the championship cross country events of the season took place in the Phoenix Park on 6th October. The novice women ran over a distance of 4000m, with Jools Hughes leading the Clonliffe team home in 12th position, followed by Alanna Burke, Katie Halpin in 25th, and Chloe Heaslip in 29th.

In the **Autumn XC '24** in Abbotstown, Emily Bolton was a hugely impressive winner of the women's U/20 race. Hazel Kenny also took 10th. A strong Clonliffe team participated in the 4x1500 mixed relay (Niamh Kelly, Lorraine O'Connor, Fintan Kerins, Sean Carrig), finishing in 4th position.

Road Racing



At the **National Road Relays '24** in Raheny, 7 ladies teams competed bravely. The senior women fielded 4 teams, the A team finished 8th in a time of 21.28, the 2nd fastest time recorded by the Clonliffe senior women – Niamh Kelly 5.08, Emma Mitchell 10.59 and Sarah Bateson 5.22. The B team finished 19th, C team in 20th with the D team taking 25th position. The women's Masters competed in W35 and W50 categories, the W35 team finished in 5th place – captain Jenny Johnston, Yuliya Tarasova and Ciara Peelo. The B team took 11th. In the W 50 category the Clonliffe team filled 7th position – Anne Lyons, Orla Deighan and Yvonne McDonagh

The senior women claimed bronze medals in the **National 5k '24**, Niamh Kelly 12th woman in a chip time of 18.05, Meghan O'Keeffe 25th, PB of 18.50 and Clodagh Galvin, 6th 18.54.

At the **National 5 mile '24** in the Phoenix Park, the senior team of Julie Larkin 31.58, Meghan O'Keeffe 32.29 and Aoife O'Reilly 32.39 finished in 5th place. The W50 team of Anne Lyons (3rd W55), Orla Deighan and Caroline Daly finished in 4th position.

In the **Leinster 10 mile / Raheny Battle of Clontarf 10 Mile** on 1st April '24, Orla Deignan won W50 Leinster gold. The W50 team of Orla Deignan, Anne Lyons and Yvonne McDonagh took Leinster silver.

At the Tallaght AC's Saint Patrick's Day 5K incorporating the **Dublin 5K Road Novice Championships**. Helena Butterly won the women's race, in a PB of 16.54. Helena led the team to fine victory with Julie Larkin, Aoife O'Reilly and Jenny Johnston, the scoring 4. The novice team of Aoife O'Reilly, Jenny Johnston, Ailbhe Morgan and Jess Laflamme Yonkman claimed bronze.

In the **Dublin 10k '24** held in Garristown the W35 team of Siobhan Devaney (44.50), Mary Ketterer (45.31), Elaine McLaughlin (45.41) and Eimear Griffin (47.37) took team gold. Siobhan also took individual W40 gold with Elaine taking W40 bronze. Mary took individual W45 bronze.



In the **Rathfarnham 5k '24**, the team placed 4th with scorers Niamh Kelly (17.37 PB), Sarah Bateson (18.15), Hazel Kenny (1st U/20, 19.16), and SORCHA GANNON (19.35 PB). Clonliffe made it a U/20 clean sweep with Hazel Kenny 1st, SORCHA GANNON 2nd, and Isla Duncan 3rd.



In the **2024, Clonliffe 2-mile** Helena Butterly was 2nd in 11.17.



In the **Christmas cake race**, Aoife O'Reilly finished 4th overall and 1st woman, Siobhan McCarthy was 1st



Master and Isla Duncan 1st junior. There was a tie for fastest woman as both Emily Bolton and Lorraine O'Connor, who started together finished together in 10.42.

At the **Lusk 4 mile '24** Helena Butterly finished 4th woman in a time of 21.59.
